

The Barony had good representation at Canterbury Faire fielding combatants in the Unbelted Tourney, Canterbury Roll Melee Tourney, Goddesses and Monsters Tourney, Fighter Auction Tourney and on the War Field.

The Unbelted Tourney saw your Baron and Baron Rudiger Adler face each other in the first round, of which Rudiger was the victor. Baron Porvaldr and Lord Porvin also faced each other in the first round, of which Porvaldr was the victor. All fought with honour past the 3rd bout.

The Fighter Auction Tourney was fought as a single kill, double elimination tournament. Baron Rudiger attained a good result for his sponsor. Your Baron was knocked out of the semi-finals by Lord Christopher, who went on to face Sir Eva and King Thibault in a three way final. Sir Eva was the victor that day for her sponsor.

The Unbelted Tourney saw your Baron and Baron Rudiger Adler face each other in the first round, of which Rudiger was the victor. Baron Þorvaldr and Lord Þorvin also faced each other in the first round, of which Þorvaldr was the victor. All fought with honour past the 3rd bout.

In the opening War Field scenarios, Your Baron was mostly in opposition of King Thibault. Teamed with mustered archers and armoured combatants, we held our line well for being newly formed but it was His Majesty's unit that took the victory.

During the timed bridge scenario, King Thibault held his ground with the valiant support of his unit. Your Baron had the honour of being ordered to hold the narrows, successfully repelling the opposing forces while His Majesty did likewise on an adjacent passageway. On the third sortie, not to be outdone, His Majesty, like Rolland on the Bridge, also took hold of this narrow pass and furthermore advanced to the enemy's rear flank to lay waste to them. It was most glorious to watch.

In a later scenario with three sorties Her Excellency Mordenvale captured the enemy's flag twice, and I once, while His Majesty, supported by our archers and the rest of our unit, kept the opposing forces pinned near their base.

Following Canterbury Faire, We attended Southron Gaard's Monthly Tournament. Where your Baron took to the field, in a best of three round robin, in which eight heavy fighters entered the list. Her Excellency was most pleased to make some new acquaintance's at this event and watch the prowess of the fencers during the rapier tourney.

At the Taskmaster's Heavy Tourney, at St Sebastian's, Master Edward gave each combatant a moniker. After an initial warm up round, involving an up and coming combatant, the field consisted of a dragon (Rudiger), a rabbit (Inigo), an eagle (Alice) and a goat (Your Baron). The great dragon drew the last breath, while the wily wabbit avoided falling to the stubborn goat and the resplendent eagle

Barely into her third decade, her slight stature and fresh grin could lure one into underestimating the great strength within, both of form and of character. The most recently authorized combatant in the Barony, and the appointed guard to the new Baron and Baroness of Ildhafn, Lady Alice has already proven herself a force to be reckoned with.

In previous years she was no stranger to period garb, for her seamstress mother had long worked alongside Mistress Christine doing theatre costume and Lady Alice had long been intrigued by that fascinating lady's tales of the Society for Creative Anachronism. In time the stars aligned, and she finally attended the Baronial Anniversary Revel in July A.S.55. Despite only knowing one person, she launched herself into dancing and singing with enthusiasm, and before long she knew she wanted to do this again – and more!

Alice's next event was the Summer Weekend some months later, due to the wretched plague harrying the land in the interim. I was delighted to see her again in our midst and invited her to aid me in running the round-robin list for the annual Rapier Championship Tournament, which task she cheerful managed entirely on her own. We later watched the Armoured Championship Tournament together, and despite not having had any combat experience, she found herself very keen to swing a sword herself.

Attending both fighter practices was unfortunately impossible, as Rapier training clashed with Alice's other passion, Sports Aerobics. Since the age of 4 she has been challenging herself physically, first at ballet and then gymnastics, until taking up aerobics at 10 years old. She is now a qualified Sports Aerobics judge as well as competing at National levels, and has enjoyed rock climbing, hockey, and sailing in her leisure time.

Having taught Alice to dance within the SCA, I had already been impressed at how quickly she learned. Her active past also prepared her well for the art of wielding a weapon, obviously by building physical strength, but more importantly by learning body awareness.

"I know how to move my body." she observed. "It certainly has helped... I know how to move quickly and move efficiently. Balance is a major thing. Knowing how science ties into it... having studied physics and physical education, there were whole sections on biomechanics, centre of gravity, and centre of mass. Because I know it in theory, and then I have done sports for so long, I can mesh the two together."

Under the guidance of Sir Willehelm von Tannenberg, Alice progressed steadily and was authorised for Armoured ("Heavy") Combat in time for Spring Coronation last October. There she fought in her first tournament, before an illustrious audience including Their Majesties of Lochac, Their Royal Highnesses of Lochac, Their Excellencies of Ildhafn and Their Excellencies of Southron Gaard. A painted wheel was spun to ascertain each weapon combination, resulting in Alice's first experience with a longsword, which she was commanded to use in one hand instead of the usual two. The weapon was approaching her own height! Nevertheless, she managed it valiantly and even managed to land a killing blow on her opponent in the bout; none other than Sir Ratbot, who, as our gentle readers will know, went on to become the Crown Prince of Lochac in months to come.

To anyone wanting to try combat for the first time, Alice advises trying out a few training sessions in loaner gear before investing substantially in your own kit. "See if you like the feeling... see if you like being in armour. Get people to throw blows at you and see if that's ok. Because... people will be hitting you in the head, and that's not for everyone."



Alice's own steel plate armour comes from ArmStreet LLC in Wisconsin, U.S.A., who have a range that includes options specifically designed for the female form, and according to their website provide for SCA, HEMA and HMB fighters. She is making herself a sword and a shield, which she will adorn with her personal arms (registration pending).

Being a smaller fighter obviously presents its challenges. "It's definitely a disadvantage being short," Alice tells me. "Because my range is shorter, I have to be within their (my opponent's) range to attack. Therefore, I must move a lot more and a lot faster to be able to do anything... if I stand still, I'm dead!"

Also having Sir Inigo Missaglia to learn from recently has been wonderful for Alice, as his stature is comparable, and he is a fast and effective fighter. She explains that Sir Inigo is adept at using a polearm weapon to counter range discrepancies, and she is interested in learning the same methods.

"For me to make a clean headshot, I'm quite often throwing blows upwards which makes generating force a lot harder, because of the biomechanics of the shoulder... it means using the smaller muscles. If you're throwing downward (or even horizontally) you can engage and contract the bigger muscles in your back and shoulder, whereas upwards you've got to use a lot more of your upper shoulder to create the same speed, which makes it a lot harder. Which is why leg shots are a thing! Because then it makes the angles work." It seems inevitable that Alice would take up one of the more energetic pastimes in the SCA, and she says combat has given her a purpose in the game, and something to build her persona around – "based on a British version of Jean d'Arc".

Whether it be joining Baron Domenego in yet another galliard (dance) in full armour – or learning to slice her opponents off at the knee – I'm quite confident that I am not alone in being eager to see what the future holds for Lady Alice Conning.

Liar's Dice

Baroness Elyna Delynor

Given that Liar's Dice appears to be the flagship sport of Ildhafn and Cluain, we thought it useful to publish a set of rules for those new to our midst, as you will certainly encounter the game before long! It is enjoyable to watch, as well as to play, and even more so if you can follow what is going on. A minimum of three players is recommended... the upper limit of players has not yet been ascertained, but the quest continues and you are invited to be a part of it!

- Each player begins with five dice; at the opening of each round, all players roll their dice on the table, but each conceals their own results from all other players.
- An opening bid is made by the first player, having only viewed their own dice, yet being aware of how many other dice are in play.
 - This consists of guessing aloud the minimum quantity of a particular dice value shown by the dice currently on the table.
 - The values from 2 through 6 can be guessed, in any quantity.
 - Any dice showing 1 is considered 'wild', and will remain changeable until the end of the round, at which point they assume the value of the last bid made.
- Moving clockwise, each next player takes their turn by either raising the bid (*see below), or by challenging the previous player's bid, using the bold accusation of "Liar!"
- There are variations on the rules for raising the bid, so before beginning the first round players must establish which method will be used.
- Often used in Ildhafn: either the quantity, the value, or both must be increased neither can be reduced.
- E.g. After a bid of "four 3s", the next player could bid "five 3s", or "four 4s", but "three 5s" or "five 2s" would be disallowed.

 Often used in Darton: allows decreasing the value, but only if the quantity is raised.

E.g. After a bid of "four 3s", a next bid of "three 5s" would not be allowed, but "five 2s" is acceptable.

- Once a player has been called a Liar, the round is over and the dice are revealed. The relevant faces according to the bid are counted (including any 1s), proving whether the player was speaking true or not. (It is customary for each player to hold up a number of fingers representing the quantity shown by their own dice, to make the process easier.)
- Of the accuser and the defender, whichever was caught in a falsehood must then lose one of their dice.
- Play thus resumes with all players rolling a new round, knowing that there are now one fewer dice in play, and the winner of the previous challenge makes the next opening bid.
- Should there arise the scenario where the remaining players have only once single die apiece left, the method of bidding changes to a single number estimating the total number of pips shown by all dice still in play.
- The last player with dice in hand is the winner!
